## **How does the Saskatchewan Health Authority (SHA) partner with the Salus Global moreOB Program?**

Saskatchewan Health Authority Maternal and Children's Provincial Program partners with Salus Global to reduce maternal and infant mortality, sustain obstetrical services, and achieve provincial healthcare benchmarks. The Maternal and Children's Provincial Program and Knowledge Mobilization Unit (KMU) team provide clinical expertise, resources, mentorship, and provincial strategy alignment.

## **What is the moreOB Program?**

The moreOB Program is a patient safety and quality improvement initiative designed to enhance maternal and infant health outcomes. It focuses on interprofessional teamwork, evidence-based education, and patient safety best practices.

## **Who is involved in the moreOB Program?**

The program engages local Core Teams of point of care healthcare providers, managers, physicians, and allied health teams who lead and sustain quality improvement initiatives in obstetrical care. ## **How does the moreOB Program impact healthcare teams and patient care?**

moreOB fosters a culture of collaborative planning, continuous learning, and standardized high-quality interprofessional care across Saskatchewan's designated obstetrical sites. It empowers teams, improves communication, and ensures safer maternal-child care, making quality healthcare more accessible and consistent across the province.

## **How does the Maternal and Children's Provincial Program Knowledge Mobilization Unit (KMU) support implementation with teams?**

The KMU provides coaching, maternal newborn program expertise, and learning resources to support the implementation which assists teams drive sustainable improvements. The KMU supports teams in person and virtually for education, quality improvement, and implementation including provincial standardization.

## **How does Salus Global support implementation with teams?**

Salus Global provides coaching, change & program management expertise, and educational

learning resources to support the implementation to help teams drive sustainable improvements

### **How is progress measured?**

Progress is tracked through milestones, team feedback, patient safety metrics, and engagement with the SG.hub platform to ensure continuous improvement.

### **How It Works**

The moreOB Program follows a structured, team-based approach with key components:

1. Information Gathering & Feedback – Collecting insights from frontline staff to guide initiatives.
2. Priority Setting & Planning – Identifying measurable objectives and tracking progress.
3. Training & Implementation – A “train-the-trainer” model where Core Teams lead quality improvement efforts within their units.
4. Technology Integration – Utilizing SG.hub, an online platform to manage activities, track milestones, and access learning materials.
5. Monitoring & Evaluation – Measuring success through benchmarks, participant engagement, and quality improvement outcomes.

### **How can you get involved?**

Interested healthcare providers can join a moreOB Core Team at their local site, participate in education sessions, engage in workshops, and contribute to quality improvement initiatives within their unit and provincially.

1. Executive Sponsor – Senior leadership champion supporting program success.
2. Core Team & Sub-Committees – Interprofessional team leading quality initiatives.
3. Team Leads – Key facilitators ensuring program alignment and team coordination.
4. Participants – Clinical Team Members engaging in needs assessment surveys, training, evaluations, providing feedback, and improvement activities.
5. Leadership Support Team – Maternal and Children’s Provincial Program KMU and senior management ensuring alignment with organizational goals.
6. Salus Global – Providing coaching, change management support, and program guidance.
